- ◆ Upon successful completion of all courses, graduates will be issued a Certificate for one year and a diploma for completion of the second year from Seven Generations Education Institute and Canadore College. Students have the option to continue on toward a Diploma in the program.

Seven Generations Education Institute began in 1985 when ten Anishinaabeg communities in the Fort Frances area had the vision of establishing an organization to meet their educational needs. It is an innovative and dynamic growing Education Institute that covers the spectrum of various education and training needs.

A partnership is an agreement made between Seven Generations Education Institute and another Canadian post secondary institution to deliver a high quality education program at the college or university level. The partnership which blends mainstream education programs with Anishinaabe content.

What Does Seven Generations Education Institute Offer Post Secondary Students?

- ◆ Ability to locally access quality education through programs
- ◆ Supportive and responsive staff to address student needs and concerns
- ◆ Access to instructors and interaction with fellow students for a full learning experience
- ◆ Content that includes the Anishinaabe worldview
- ◆ Computer lab with current software and internet applications
- ◆ Library to access resource material

The **Indigenous Wellness and Addictions Prevention Program** is designed to develop skills and knowledge of those seeking to work in the Human Service field or is presently working in a related field. Through the study of theory and research, students will gain



skills related to traditional knowledge and challenges that communities face such as addictions. Students will also complete a field placement in which their skills will be implemented. It is a program that incorporates traditional knowledge and methods of healing in a unique approach to wellness and helping others.

Admission Requirements:

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or its equivalent.
- Mature Students are encouraged to apply, please see below.

What is Mature Student Status?

Applicants who do not possess an OSSD but who will be 19 years of age before the date of registration and can demonstrate potential for success in college studies. Mature Student applicants take the Canadian Adult Achievement Test (C.A.A.T.).
