Residential Trades Instructor

Job Description

The Residential Trades Instructor will plan, organize, and implement an appropriate instructional program in a learning environment that guides and encourages students to develop and fulfill their potential. The instructor is responsible for the supervision and evaluation of all students within the program they have been assigned to teach. The instructor will work within an established framework for the delivery of educational services/programs. The instructor will work collaboratively with the Employment Navigators and Training Coordinators within Seven Generations Education Institute.

The Residential Trades Instructor will have experience in commercial and residential construction, or general contracting. Incumbent will have proven experience within the trades of Carpentry, Electrical, and/or Plumbing. The instructor will be responsible for providing students with a solid foundation in trades and hands-on experience in; operating tools and equipment, layout, and construction of wood frame structures, apply interior and exterior finishes, and much more. Teach students how to use equipment in a safe manner.

Qualifications and skills requirements

1. Industry recognized certificate or equivalent. A Red Seal certification in Carpentry, Electrical or Plumbing would be an asset.
2. A minimum of five (5) years experience in residential construction.
3. An equivalent combination of education and experience may be considered on a case-by-case basis.
4. Excellent communication skills (both oral and written) as well as strong interpersonal, organizational and computer skills.
5. Previous experience in providing instructional services.
6. The ability to speak Anishinaabemowin would be considered an asset.

Supervisor: Director of Training

Job duties/responsibilities

1. Instruct students, using various teaching methods, for example lecture and demonstration, and use audiovisual aids and other materials to supplement presentations.
2. Prepare course objectives and outline for course of study following curriculum guidelines or requirements.
3. Teach courses in Site Layout, Foundation Systems, Trades Calculations, Wood Framing, Blueprint reading, Residential Constructions, and any other related topics.
4. Assign lessons and assignments.



5. Evaluate students' progress, records results, and issues reports to inform students of their progress
6. Keep and maintain attendance records, and follow up with Employment Navigator, as needed.
7. Maintain discipline in classroom.
8. Participates in meetings and instructor training, when required.
9. Instruct and monitor students in the use of learning materials and equipment
10. Update all necessary records accurately and completely as required
11. Instructors may be required to attend professional development training sessions

Relationships

Internal

1. Interacts and reports directly to the Director of Training
2. Work with Training Department staff primarily

External

1. Liaise with visitors.
2. Ability to network with community members and partners when required.
3. Represent SGEI for recruitment purposes.

Working conditions

- Position typically works indoors in shared office space.
- Requirement to work outdoors for extended periods with occasional exposure to adverse weather conditions.
- Frequent travel to area communities will be required.
- May be exposed to noise, and on rare occasions to behaviourally difficult students, clients, and members of the public.
- Normally a seven (7) hour workday with occasional requirements for overtime. Supervisor will need to preapprove any overtime requirements.
- A moderate level of manual dexterity required to use desktop computer and peripherals, with a moderate requirement for accuracy.
- Lifting or moving up to 50lbs may be required.
